

Household Hazardous Waste Collection

No more 4-hour collections.

The District is in the process of permitting a permanent, seasonal household hazardous waste facility. It will be open mid- to late- May through September, by appointment only. When we get all of the permits and containers in place, we will advertise the days and hours that the facility is open. There will be a nominal charge—\$10 for up to 10 gallons/car.

Bring:

aerosols
antifreeze
automotive products
gasoline
hobby chemicals
household cleaners
kerosene
mercury thermometers
mercury thermostats
paint
paint cleaners
pesticides
pool chemicals

Bring in a mercury thermometer—get a free digital thermometer.

Do NOT Bring:

asbestos ammunition fireworks medical waste medicines radioactive material

Transfer stations take:

- ♦ computers, printers
- household batteries
- fluorescent bulbs *All for free.*

There is a bucket outside of the Town Office for 24/7 collection of: AA, AAA, C, D, 9v, rechargeable, and hearing aid batteries.

All wastes in 55-gallon drums— MUST call ahead

Used motor oil is accepted at Adams Trucking and Excavating at 151 Saxtons River Road in Westminster (463-2213), and Matulonis Body Shop in

Springfield (885-5000).

Call first to confirm. These businesses want the oil to be "clean" - no water, no antifreeze, no other fluids mixed with it.

Both oil-based and latex **paint** are accepted **year-round**, **for free**, by Bibens Home Center and Sherwin-Williams in Springfield. The paint cans must not be rusty or leaky.



Bring the rusty, leaky cans, if there is still paint in them, to the permanent HHW facility in Springfield.

Recyclables & Trash

Athens has curbside trash pick-up every other Monday morning. Trash needs to be placed in Town of Athens bags which can be purchased for \$3.50 each at the Town Office on Mondays between 9:00 am and 1:00 pm or by other arrangement with the Town Clerk, (802) 869-3370.

Recycling is picked up every other week on Monday and is free of charge. Recyclables (paper, aluminum, cardboard, steel, glass, and #1 and #2 hard plastics) need to be clean, dry, and in an appropriate container. For specifics, ask the trash hauler. For recycling dates, contact the Town Office or check the calendar on the Town's website, www.athensvt.com. Both services are open to all residents of Athens.

There are other materials that can and need to be recycled. Items described below are accepted at the Rockingham Transfer Station, 7446 Route 5 (just south of Bellows Falls Union High School) which is open on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays, 8:00 a.m.—1:00 p.m. All vehicles using the facility must display a current access permit which may be purchased at the Rockingham Town Hall.

All kinds of batteries are accepted and recycled **for free** at the Rockingham Transfer Station: AA, AAA, C, D, 9v, hearing aid, watch, and rechargeable <u>batteries</u>.



Fluorescent tubes (10/visit) and bulbs (unlimited number) have mercury in them so they need to be disposed of properly. The Rockingham Transfer Station accepts them **for free**.





Televisions, computer monitors, printers, hard-drives, and peripherals are recycled **for free** at the Transfer Station.

Useable, saleable **clothing** is accepted at the SEVCA Good Buy Store at 45 Rockingham Street in Bellows Falls and at the Community Closet Thrift Store in the basement of the Immanuel Episcopal Church, 20 Church St., Bellows Falls.

Backyard Composters for Sale

The District is offering Soil Saver composters for sale for \$65. The 100% recycled plastic composter is 28" wide x 28" deep x 32" high and has a 10-year manufacturer's guarantee.





We also sell Sure-Close food-scrap pails for \$5 each.
